Q1. Write in brief about National Security Council.

Ans 1: The National Security Council is chaired by the Prime Minister which looks after all the security matters of the country and formulates national security policies which are required to be implemented by the federal and provincial government.

Q2. Write three functions of Union Council.

Ans 1: 1- To approve the budget of the council and to approve taxes or fees.
2- Rehabilitating public roads, streets, cemeteries, gardens and sports fields.
3- To appoint the members of the Panchayat and monitor their performance.

Q3. Write three duties of the Federation under the 1973 Constitution.

Ans 1: 1- All the duties of the Federation are performed by the Prime Minister and his cabinet.
2- The Federation restores the country's economy and imposes taxes.
3- Federation regulates internal and external trade.

Q4. Who is the Chairman of Gilgit -Baltistan Council.

Ans 1: The Chairman of Gilgit-Baltistan Council is the Prime Minister of Pakistan.

Q5. State the number of members of the Kashmir Council.

Ans 1: The Number of members of Kashmir Council is 14.

Q6. State three functions of a District or Tehsil Council.

Ans 1: 1- To create the spirit of welfare works and social reform among the citizens.
2- To evaluate the performances of district or tehsil officers.
3- To construct bridges and other public buildings.

Q7. Write down three functions of the metropolitan corporations in brief.

Ans 1: 1- To approve land plans, environmental plans and urban plans.
2- To approve and enforce laws and bylaws.
3- To punish violators of municipal laws.

Q8. What is the other name of Chief Court.

Ans 1: Its other name is Chief Court of Appeal

Q9. State the different levels of local governments.

Ans 1: Under local governments, a two-tier system was created in rural areas and a three-tier system was created in urban areas.

Q10. State Three functions of municipal or town committee.

Ans 1: 1- Making development plans approving them and arranging finance for them.
2- To regulate the distribution of local lands and their use.
3- To arrange and maintain roads and streets.
