Q1. What is meant by the bil of sight.
Ans 1: If the importer cannot provide the information for goods then he requests the customs authorities for the inspectin of goods with the help of this bill.
Q2. What is the meant by consular invoice.
<b>Ans 1:</b> Consular invoice is a certificate which shows that the value of the exported goods mentined there in is correct. This certificate is issued by consular officer situated inexporiting country.
Q3. What is F.O.B
Ans 1: This includes cost of goods and all the charges on goods up to the placement of goods on ship including railway freight and cost of loading on ship etc.
Q4. What is meant by delivery order.
Ans 1: If any person other than owner of goods wants to collect goods from ware house of port warehouses then he has to present the delivery order endorsed by teh importer of goods in his favour.
Q5. State the procedure or steps of importing goods.

Ans 2: iii- Acceptance letter iv- Opening of letter of credit
Ans 3: v- Intimation of sending goods vi- Dispatch of documents

Q7. What is the meant by F.A.S. Price.

**Ans 1:** F.A.S is price when includes cost of goods plus expenses to deliver goods on the vesel freight chargers, packing chartges, export duty and dock charges etc.

Q8. What is menat by ex ship price.

**Ans 1:** Ex-ship price includes cost of goods plus delivery charges, dock chartges, ship freight, export duty and loading charges etc.

Q9. What is F.O.R

Ans 1: The prices include all the expenses from factory to railway including boarding but donot include railway freight.

Q10. Define Import Trade.

Ans 1: When goods are received in home country after purchasing them from other countries is called import trade.
